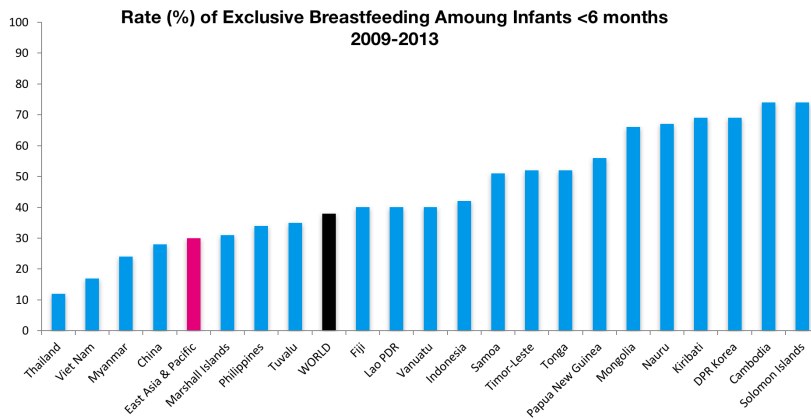


Regional Situational Analysis

The UNICEF EAPRO Regional Situational Analysis (SitAn) provides the organization evidence and analysis for the East Asia and Pacific region, informing the development and monitoring of regional programming.

The UNICEF Regional Office for East Asia and the Pacific has commissioned CSF to undertake an analysis of the condition of children (boys and girls) and women in the region. The rights-based, equity focused situational analysis includes: 1) a disaggregated assessment of the status and trends in realizing children’s and women’s rights, 2) an analysis of the immediate and underlying causes of shortfalls, and 3) policy and programmatic recommendations to address disparities and accelerate progress towards the achievement of national and regional development goals.

Features

- Data-driven analysis of the condition of children and women in East Asia and the Pacific
- Focused assessment of disparities across the region
- Evidence supports decision-making at the regional and country level
- Infographics and data visualizations highlight findings from key indicators

Benefits

- Improves the understanding of the status of children and women in EAP and the rights deprivations they face
- Identifies the main patterns of disparities and inequities within countries
- Provides analysis on the causes, barriers and bottlenecks to rights realization that are common across the region
- Supports regional planning processes, providing the background for discussion of regional programme priorities and the baselines for potential headline results
